Concurrent Enrollment (CE)

Concurrent Enrollment courses are college-level classes, through SLCC or Weber State, that are taught at Bingham by Bingham teachers.

Why take them?

- Students receive BOTH college and high school credit.
- These courses stand out during the college admissions process.
- Skip introductory college courses.
- Easier to transfer credits in state (compared to AP).

*****You MUST apply for a “S or W” number by the end of this school year*****

*Just like regular high school classes, you can't transfer out of these classes after the class change period has passed.

Concurrent Enrollment Night!



SLCC Concurrent Enrollment Transition Tuition Waiver

- \$1000 total (\$500 for 2 semesters)*
- Apply **HERE** between November 1st and February 1st of your senior year
- Complete 6 or more SLCC concurrent enrollment credits with a 3.0 or higher GPA in those classes
- Create an academic plan with SLCC
- Change status from concurrent to regular enrollment
- Apply for financial aid
- Register for classes

* Can only be used at SLCC. Subject to change or cancellation.

Work Experience

- Earn elective credit for working a job
- Seniors can take up to 4 consecutive periods of work release
- Must provide copies of pay stubs through Canvas that show total hours and that taxes are being deducted
- Counselor can provide the necessary paperwork
- Must have a job before the quarter begins



Non-Academic Release

vs.

Educational Release

- Periods where classes are not scheduled
- No credit is provided for these periods
- Must be on track to graduate
- **Needs to be consecutive periods**
- We recommend taking advantage of other opportunities in lieu of non-ed release
- Only for Seniors
- **Cannot be at Bingham during non-academic release periods**
- Meet with your counselor to complete the paperwork in April

- Periods in your high school schedule to pursue outside educational opportunities (On-campus college courses, trade schools etc.)
- Must provide your college/course schedule
- After completing the course, must provide a transcript from the college or university to get high school credit
- See your counselor to start the paperwork in April

NCAA Eligibility



Must be eligible to participate in Division I, II, and III.

- ***The student and parent is responsible for ensuring eligibility.***
- Read through the NCAA eligibility center guide
- Look at your classes to see if they're NCAA approved
- Make-up classes with an NCAA approved method (complete before the start of senior year)
- Have 10 of the 16 core requirements completed by the end of Junior year
- Register with the NCAA at **www.eligibilitycenter.org**
- Counselors can assist if they know you're working toward eligibility

Certificate

Entry-level employment in a particular career.

Typical Program Length:
One Year

Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.)

Provides broad knowledge for solid employment preparation and possible career advancement.

Typical Program Length:
Two Years

Associate of Arts (A.A.) and Associate of Science (A.S.)

Provides an academic foundation for transfer to a four-year degree.

Typical Program Length:
Two Years

Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) and Bachelor of Science (B.S.)

Provides specialized knowledge for entry into career or preparation for future study at the graduate level.

Typical Program Length:
Four Years

Master's or Professional

Provides qualification for a particular career or for career advancement requiring preparation beyond the bachelor's degree or for entry into doctoral program.

Typical Program Length:
Two or Three Years

Doctorate

Provides career entry or advancement for fields requiring experience in research methods.

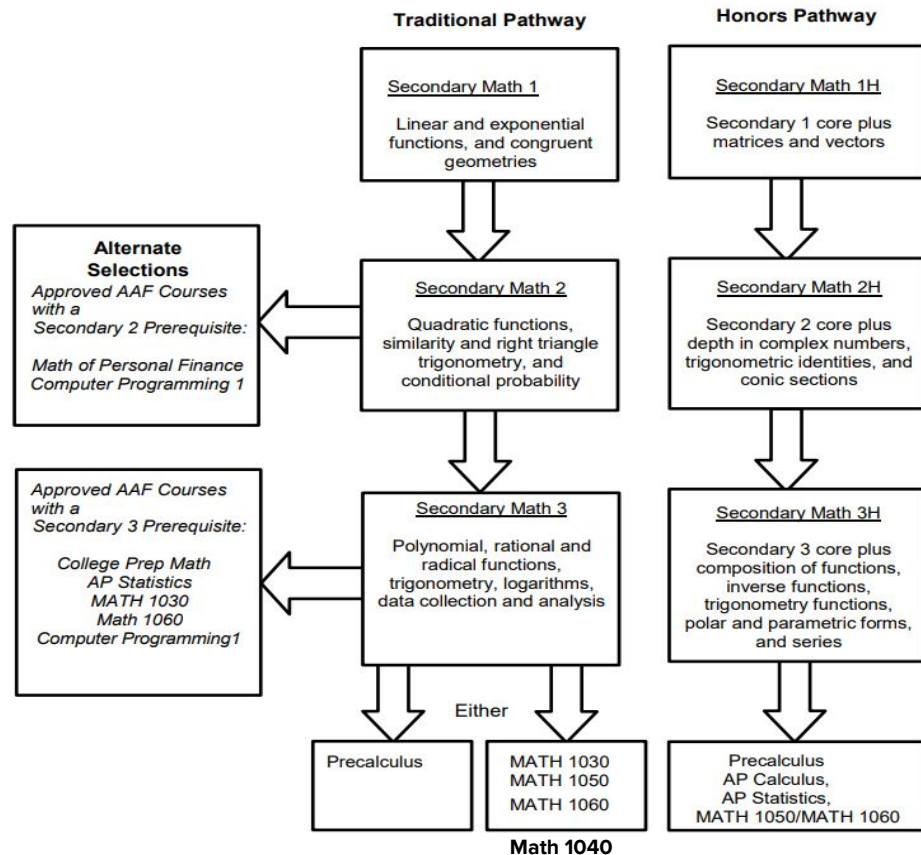
