#### TYPES OF DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES

From one-year certificates to four-year degrees, higher education equals opportunity.

Different careers require different levels of education. Here's a breakdown to understand the kind of education required for the career you want.

#### Certificate

Entry-level employment in a particular career.

#### Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.)

Provides broad knowledge for solid employment preparation and possible career advancement.

Typical Program Length: One Year

#### Typical Program Length: Two Years

#### Associate of Arts (A.A.) and Associate of Science (A.S.)

Provides an academic foundation for transfer to a four-year degree.

Typical Program Length: Two Years

#### Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) and Bachelor of Science (B.S.)

Provides specialized knowledge for entry into career or preparation for future study at the graduate level.

> Typical Program Length: Four Years

#### Master's or Professional

Provides qualification for a particular career or for career advancement requiring preparation beyond the bachelor's degree or for entry into doctoral program.

Typical Program Length: Two or Three Years

#### Doctorate

Provides career entry or advancement for fields requiring experience in research methods.

> Typical Program Length: Four Years



These are rigorous, college-level courses in a variety of subjects. They give students the opportunity to develop the academic skills desired by colleges and universities, along with the opportunity to earn college credit.

#### Why take AP Classes?

- Stand out during the college admissions process
- Earn college credit (Score 3\*, 4, or 5 on AP test)
- Skip introductory college courses
- Easier to transfer credits out of state (compared to concurrent enrollment)

# **CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT (CE) COURSES**

Concurrent Enrollment courses are college-level classes, through SLCC or Weber State, that are taught at Bingham by Bingham teachers.

#### Why take CE classes?

- Receive <u>BOTH</u> college and high school credit
- Stand out during the college admissions process.
- Earn college credit for introductory courses (many are gen ed requirements)
- Easier to transfer credits in state (compared to AP).




