Thank you for your interest in the Carrington Court Annual Scholarship that is awarded to the student that creates the most innovative, organized, exciting, engaging idea/activity that will benefit the residents of Carrington Court through entertainment or education.

There will be three scholarships awarded:

One \$1,000, one \$500 and one \$500

Guidelines and information regarding scholarship is as follows:

10th, 11th, or 12th grade students may submit application.

This scholarship is not grade based.

Activity must be at least one hour in length.

Activity must be organized by scholarship applicant, but scholarship applicant must enlist help of a couple friends, family or church to carry out activity. This will ensure that their scholarship activity is successful.

Activity must be able to be done inside, unless mild weather.

Activity must be done Monday – Friday. Event must be completed by 4:00 p.m.

IMPORTANT

Activity must be reviewed by the Carrington Court Activities Director before acceptance is granted.

One week upon completion of your scholarship activity you must submit a three page, double spaced, 12 pt. font word essay describing the; creation and organization of the activity and what you learned from it and how you engaged the residents. Ten pictures of the event must be submitted along with essay.

Applications for the scholarship activity must be submitted no later than the last weekday in February. We encourage students to fill out applications as early as possible and complete scholarship activity as early as possible!

Scholarship Activity must be completed by: No later than the second week of April

Ideas for acceptable activity:

All song, dance and musical programs should have 50 percent of the program devoted to 1930's, 40's and 50's with accompanying program handout and master of ceremony narrator.

Dance program – all varieties of dance are of interest, but must include in at least 50 percent of the program songs and dance from the 1930's, 40's and 50's w accompanying program handout and master of ceremony narrator.

Musical program - vocal, instrumental, band, orchestra

Sing-A-Long – with songs familiar to Carrington Court residents with musical accompaniment and song booklet or large printed words on display in front of room.

Art Show – Must have students to give individual narrations to residents regarding art

Perform a mini play – musical, theatrical – (something residents will understand) may include residents in simple parts.

Veterans Program – honoring the veterans of Carrington with flag ceremony, talk, musical performance, award presentation, etc.

Talent Show with multiple performances of varying types

Teach class and engage residents – (keep in very simplistic) painting, drawing, craft item

Science Experiment Presentation that has interactive demonstrations

Presentation regarding history of Utah or something of interest to the residents with multiple forms of media (Transcontinental Railroad, history of Bingham Canyon Mine, etc.)

Create a photo exhibit that would interest the residents (the photo exhibit may be of the resident themselves)

Create an all-interactive game for the residents and group of students that may be played together and is positive and energetic – residents must be involved

Residents of Carrington Court are of the average age of 85. Our residents either have a physical impairment or mental impairment. They enjoy music, activities of all variety, entertainment/education that is geared toward and for them. Carrington residents are from the World War II generation. This will be beneficial for you to know as you relate pertaining activities to this area (songs, music, history, etc.)
