TYPES OF DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES

From one-year certificates to four-year degrees, higher education equals opportunity. Different careers require different levels of education. Here's a breakdown to understand the kind of education required for the career you want.

Certificate

Entry-level employment in a particular career.

Typical Program Length:
One Year

Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.)

Provides broad knowledge for solid employment preparation and possible career advancement.

Typical Program Length:
Two Years

Associate of Arts (A.A.) and Associate of Science (A.S.)

Provides an academic foundation for transfer to a four-year degree.

Typical Program Length:
Two Years

Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) and Bachelor of Science (B.S.)

Provides specialized knowledge for entry into career or preparation for future study at the graduate level.

Typical Program Length:
Four Years

Master's or Professional

Provides qualification for a particular career or for career advancement requiring preparation beyond the bachelor's degree or for entry into doctoral program.

Typical Program Length:
Two or Three Years

Doctorate

Provides career entry or advancement for fields requiring experience in research methods.

Typical Program Length:
Four Years

All Digital Studies classes offer CTE graduation credit. Please note alternate graduation credit per class. The Digital Studies (0.5 credit) requirement for secondary school graduation is intended to advance students from being computer users to being computationally literate creators. The following courses fulfill this requirement:

83161 BUSINESS OFFICE SPECIALIST

Class fee required.

This course develops advanced Microsoft Office skills that are vital for success in education and professional environments. Students will produce authentic business materials using and integrating word-processing, spreadsheet, database, and presentation software. Industry Certification will be offered through Microsoft Office Specialist exams, allowing students to demonstrate their proficiency to employers. Participation in FBLA may be an integral part of this course.

81211 COMPUTER PROGRAMMING I

Class fee required Prerequisite: Secondary Mathematics 1 (mandatory).

This course is an introductory programming course using the Python language. Students learn the fundamentals of computer programming by designing, coding, and testing their own programs while applying mathematical concepts. Teachers introduce basic coding concepts and problem-solving skills. Participation in FBLA/Skills USA may be an integral part of this course.

WORK EXPERIENCE

1 period = 32 Hrs/Quarter

- Earn elective credit

(This averages out to about 4 hours per week per period.)

How to schedule:

- Request 1-2 less credits on your course request (ex. 6 credits instead of 8)
