TYPES OF DEGREES AND CERTIFICATES

From one-year certificates to four-year degrees, higher education equals opportunity. Different careers require different levels of education. Here's a breakdown to understand the kind of education required for the career you want.

Certificate

Entry-level employment in a particular career.

Typical Program Length:
One Year

Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.)

Provides broad knowledge for solid employment preparation and possible career advancement.

Typical Program Length:
Two Years

Associate of Arts (A.A.) and Associate of Science (A.S.)

Provides an academic foundation for transfer to a four-year degree.

Typical Program Length:
Two Years

Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) and Bachelor of Science (B.S.)

Provides specialized knowledge for entry into career or preparation for future study at the graduate level.

Typical Program Length:
Four Years

Master's or Professional

Provides qualification for a particular career or for career advancement requiring preparation beyond the bachelor's degree or for entry into doctoral program.

Typical Program Length:
Two or Three Years

Doctorate

Provides career entry or advancement for fields requiring experience in research methods.



ACT / SAT



*The ACT test is accepted by all schools in the state of Utah. Some out of state schools may require the SAT, but most schools accept either test.

*Most colleges have waived ACT requirements for admissions. Make sure to check.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COURSES

These are rigorous, college-level courses in a variety of subjects. They give students the opportunity to develop the academic skills desired by colleges and universities, along with the opportunity to earn college credit.

Why take them?

- Stand out during the college admissions process
- Earn college credit with a score of 3*, 4, or 5 on AP test
- Skip introductory college courses
- Easier to transfer credits out of state compared to concurrent enrollment credits

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT (CE) COURSES

Concurrent Enrollment courses are college-level classes, through SLCC or Weber State, that are taught at Bingham by Bingham teachers.

Why take them?

- Students receive BOTH college and high school credit.
- These courses stand out during the college admissions process.
- Earn college credit for these introductory courses.
- Easier to see how credits transfer in state.

- SLCC's **Certificate of Completion** helps students complete general education requirements
 - Contact Bingham's SLCC CE Rep, Elena Justice, if interested in Certificate ([Contact Info](#))
- Review math flow chart / college websites to enroll in correct math class
- Review [Concurrent Enrollment Quick Facts](#)
- Remember Bingham vs Concurrent Enrollment deadlines are different.
 - Dropping a CE course with SLCC after the first 10 days of the quarter means you will still keep your grade and be placed in an equivalent BHS course. (For example, from MATH 1050 to Pre-Calculus)

SLCC Concurrent Enrollment Transition Tuition Waiver

This is an automatic scholarship for completing 6 or more CE credits (2 classes) with a C or better.

The award is a full-tuition scholarship for the first two semesters at SLCC after high school graduation.



WORK EXPERIENCE (WORK RELEASE)

- Earn elective credit for working a job
- Seniors can take up to 4 periods of work release (In blocked time frame)
- Must provide copies of pay stubs through Canvas that shows pay period and total hours and that taxes are being deducted
- Counselor can provide the necessary paperwork in August
- Must have a job before the quarter begins



ONLINE CLASS OPTIONS

- Parent or guardian permission is required to enroll
 - Talk to your counselor for more information and to check if online classes are a good fit
 - Online students should be motivated and able to manage their time effectively to stay on track with assignments
- *Student will still enter the class with in person course requests because online registration is not open yet
- 

NON-ACADEMIC (HOME) RELEASE

Guidelines:

- No credit is provided for these periods
- Must be on track to graduate
- Need to be consecutive periods
- Only for Seniors
- Cannot be at Bingham during non-academic release periods

How to enroll:

- Meet with your counselor to make sure you are on track
- Parents must provide authorization for non-academic release
- Counselors must account for every period of the your day

***We recommend taking advantage of other opportunities in lieu of non-academic release**



NCAA ELIGIBILITY



**The student and parent are responsible for ensuring eligibility.*

Steps:

- Read through the NCAA eligibility center guide
- Check your classes to make sure they are NCAA approved
- Complete any make-up classes with an NCAA-approved method (complete before the start of senior year)
- Have at least 10 of the 16 core requirements completed by the end of Junior year
- Register with the NCAA at www.eligibilitycenter.org
