

Virtual Learning Options for Jordan District Students

Looking for a virtual option to replace in-person classes? Want to free up some space in your regular schedule for other courses? Need to recover credit in a class? Here are some great options available to you!



KINGS PEAK HIGH SCHOOL (Grades 9-12)

Kings Peak High School follows a well-proven format for students to be successful in virtual learning. Students participate in virtual live instruction twice a week in every class and complete work through Canvas. Teachers offer additional support through electronic or in-person communication as needed. Students enjoy a high degree of flexibility in where and when they complete work and teachers are there to support them to ensure they continue to learn at a high level. Courses follow the same calendar and align with the term dates of the rest of Jordan School District. Students can enroll full-time at Kings Peak or remain enrolled in their current school and take courses at Kings Peak on a part-time basis.



JORDAN CREDIT CENTER (Grades 9-12)

Jordan Credit Center serves grades 9-12 in the Jordan School District. We offer asynchronous online flexible enrollment options that include original credit, grade replacement, credit recovery, and demonstrated competency assessments. Students sign up for our program with their school counselors and can register for classes at any point during the school year. Students should finish each quarter of a course within a 9 week period. Jordan Credit Center also offers a Summer Semester which begins the week after 4th Quarter ends. Students sign up for courses with their school counselor during 4th Quarter. Courses are offered during a 9 week session and must be completed by the deadline. KELSEY PEAK VIRTUAL MIDDLE SCHOOL (Grades 7-8)

Kelsey Peak Virtual Middle School follows a well-proven format to help students succeed in virtual learning. Students participate in live virtual instruction twice a week in every class and complete work in Canvas in a module format. There is an optional in-person social/academic time each Friday for students to help build on the district's Middle School Philosophy. Teachers offer additional support through electronic or in-person communication as needed. Courses follow the same middle school calendar and align with the term and semester dates used by the rest of the Jordan School District. Students can enroll full-time at Kelsey Peak or remain enrolled at their current school and take part-time courses there.

How do I register?	<p>Students who would like to attend Kings Peak HS or Kelsey Peak Virtual MS full time can enroll directly with each school. More information is available at www.jordanvirtual.org</p> <p>Students who wish to take individual classes with Kings Peak HS, Kelsey Peak Virtual MS, or the Jordan Credit Center can start the enrollment process by meeting with their current school counselor. Registration in Jordan School District virtual classes follows the same class change deadlines as your in-person school.</p> <p>Enrollment in classes through the Jordan Credit Center happens throughout the year, so sign-ups are available at any time.</p>
Can I take classes during the school day?	Yes! You can replace classes during the school day with virtual classes offered through the Jordan School District. Your counselor can help you decide if you stay on campus or leave during these classes.
Can I take classes outside the school day?	Yes! Many classes at both schools are offered asynchronously, which means you can work on content and assignments for the class on your own schedule.
Can I take classes during the summer?	Kings Peak HS and Kelsey Peak Virtual MS follow the Jordan School District calendar and do not offer classes during the summer. Summer classes are available through the Jordan Credit Center. See creditcenter.jordandistrict.org for registration details and deadlines.
How do I get help with my classes?	Your class will be taught by a Jordan District teacher who will be available to offer help and support! You will also have a counselor available at your school who can help answer questions and assist with your plan for college and career readiness. Classes are also automatically added to your existing JSD Skyward, Canvas, and other accounts.
Do I have to change which school I am enrolled at?	<p>Which school you should be enrolled at can depend on a number of factors, including your specific educational goals, the number of classes you are taking in-person or virtually, what type of diploma you are looking to earn, and whether or not you are receiving services on an IEP. Your counselor and administrators can help identify what school program best meets your needs and your plans for graduation.</p> <p>Jordan Credit Center classes can be taken while enrolled at either an in-person or virtual school.</p>

Additional Virtual Learning Options



State Online Education Program

Utah students can participate in virtual classes through the State Online Education Program, or SOEP. SOEP classes are self-paced and self-directed. Students can replace periods of their regular schedule with SOEP classes, but are limited to six credits per year through SOEP under Utah law (unless they are using SOEP to graduate earlier than the end of their senior year).

How do I register?	<p>Students can only add or drop SOEP classes during the same deadlines for adding or dropping classes at their in-person/boundary school. Unless a student is planning to graduate early AND has created an early graduation plan with their school counselor, changing from in-person classes to SOEP classes is not permitted under Utah law outside the in-person/boundary school's registration window.</p> <p>Registrations are submitted at seats.schools.utah.gov.</p>
Can I take classes during the school day?	SOEP classes can replace classes during the regular school day, but students who are not intending to graduate early are limited to six credits per academic year through SOEP under Utah law.
Can I take classes outside the school day?	Students can work on SOEP classes outside the school day, but students who are not intending to graduate early are limited to six credits per academic year through SOEP under Utah law.
Can I take classes during the summer?	<p>Students who are not intending to graduate early may take summer classes through SOEP but must drop an equivalent number of classes from an adjacent semester's schedule, as their total enrollment cannot exceed that of a full-time student under Utah law.</p> <p>Students who are intending to graduate early may take summer classes if these classes are part of the early graduation plan created with their school counselor.</p>
How do I get help with my classes?	<p>SOEP classes are not offered through or supervised by the Jordan School District. Students will need to work with the provider of the course if there are questions or concerns.</p> <p>Your school counselor can only help with dropping regular classes from your schedule to add SOEP classes.</p>
Do I have to change which school I am enrolled at?	SOEP classes do not change a student's school of enrollment.

Other Third-Party Providers

There are a variety of other third-party providers who offer virtual class opportunities. If these providers are accredited by a national school accrediting organization, any credits earned from these providers can be added to your transcript as transfer credit.

As Jordan School District does not monitor or work with third-party providers, your school counselor cannot help with registration, instruction, or other issues that may arise.
