Driver's Education

Summer

- You must turn 16 **BEFORE** **October 15th, 2026** in order to be eligible for Summer Driver's Ed.
- Register on **binghamminers.org** under 'Driver's Education'
 - Starting **March 9th** for boundary students
 - Starting **March 16th** for out of district students
- 2 Sessions: one in June and one in July

School Year

- Driver's Ed & Miner Wellness are taught in same semester
- Your birthday determines which quarter you are eligible to take Driver's Ed:
 - 1st Quarter: 9/17/2010 - 1/19/2011
 - 2nd Quarter: 1/20/2011 - 4/15/2011
 - 3rd Quarter: 4/16/2011 - 6/23/2011
 - 4th Quarter: 6/24/2011 - 10/28/2011

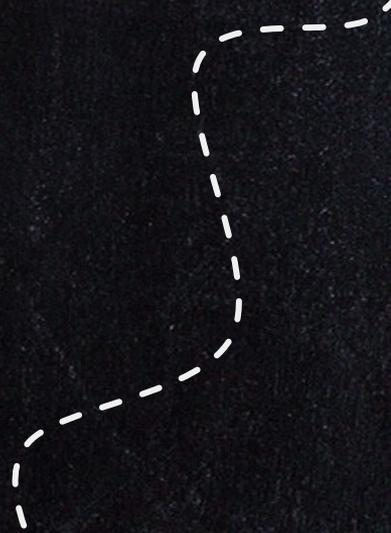

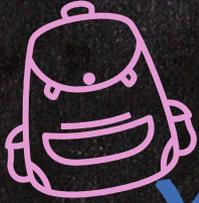
