While the GPA and extracurricular activities are important, the essay and your financial need's will weigh heavily in determining the selected student.

The application must include an essay of approximately 1000 words.

The essay needs to adhere to the following guidelines.

I am inspired by my pioneer ancestors, and the obstacles they encountered. Share with us how you have adhered to the pioneer ideals of Faith in God, Loyalty to Church, Country and Family, Courage in adversity, service to others and hard work. Also include an experience when you have overcome significant adversity in health, economic or social conditions in your own life. Tell us about your financial need, (if any), and why you would be a good choice for this scholarship.

The application must include a letter of recommendation. From an adult not related to you, and should attest to your good character.

The deadline for the application is March 27, 2026, the selected applicant will be notified by the end of April.
